IUPUI is a core campus of Indiana University and the state’s urban research and academic health sciences campus. IUPUI enrolls more than 30,000 students, including over 8,000 graduate students, with full-time faculty and staff numbering nearly 9,000, including 2,700 full-time faculty, an annual budget of \$1.3 billion, and external research funding of more than \$325 million in the 2013-14 fiscal year. IUPUI offers more than 220 degree programs in 17 schools, including the schools of liberal arts and science, as well as professional schools of business, education, law, art & design, physical education and tourism management, nursing, engineering & technology, public & environmental affairs, dentistry, health and rehabilitation sciences, informatics and computing, social work, public health, philanthropy, and medicine. IUPUI’s schools offer more than 140 IU degree programs and more than 80 Purdue university degree programs. As Chief Academic Officer, I provide leadership for all academic units and serve as IUPUI’s Chief Executive Officer in the Chancellor’s absence. The deans of all schools at IUPUI report to the CAO, as do leaders of academic support units on campus including the Division of Enrollment Management, the Division of Undergraduate Education, the IUPUI Graduate Office, the IUPUI Honors College, the Office of International Affairs, and the Office for Institutional Research and Decision Support.

## Administrative Accomplishments include:

- Restructured the Office of Academic Affairs to increase efficiencies, improve communication, and align positions with strategic needs of the office. Developed a listserv to support communication to department chairs and program leaders across schools.
- A new office of [Institutional Research and Decision Support](#) was created in Fall, 2015 to provide accurate, timely and actionable information to campus leaders and to support efforts to achieve the goals set forth in the campus strategic plan. IUPUI has built a national reputation for evidence-supported decision making, and this office combines strengths in institutional research with expertise in analytics, survey research, and program evaluation in order to sustain a “culture of evidence” that guides continuous improvement.
- We have shifted into implementation of ACE’s Internationalization Strategy for IUPUI and are preparing to expand international experiences for undergraduates through the RISE program and to increase scholarships for study abroad, particularly for students from underserved groups.
- Expanding recruitment of students into targeted degree programs with capacity for growth through the Midwest Student Exchange Program.
- Reviewed and implemented changes in operating and fiscal procedures between IUPUI campus administration and the School of Medicine in order to promote efficiencies and eliminate barriers to recruiting and retaining clinical faculty and staff

- Reviewed and revised processes to support annual campus planning and budgeting reports.
- Supported the transition to banded tuition and the planned expansion of need-based aid to support undergraduate students at IUPUI.
- Led planning to support the development of a culture of innovation and entrepreneurship among IUPUI students, in partnership with faculty, staff, and business/industry/community organizations.
- In collaboration with the Office of Diversity Equity and Inclusion, taken steps to improve support for the recruitment and retention of students from diverse groups, particularly LGBTQ+, African American and Latino students, by increasing holistic support services and championing the need to improve classroom climate through enhanced professional development for faculty. Currently planning for improvements in the recruitment and retention of diverse faculty and academic leaders.

IUPUI has a record of success in developing innovative undergraduate curricula and in creating opportunities for undergraduates to engage in high impact practices. IUPUI is nationally recognized for excellence in areas such as the first year experience, service learning and themed learning communities, and the IUPUI Principles of Undergraduate Learning a provide a flexible, principle-based framework for planning and evaluating undergraduate curricula. University College enrolls approximately 6,500 students each year and provides a common entry to the academic programs available to entering students. As AVC for Undergraduate Education and Dean of University College, I provided administrative leadership for student support services, the first year experience (orientation, bridge, first year seminars), peer mentoring and tutoring, cohort-based programs (e.g., 21<sup>st</sup> Century Scholars, Diversity Enrichment & Achievement Program), early college (SPAN), student employment and transfer student services, as well as faculty development aligned with gateway course instruction. With the launch of the Division of Undergraduate Education, I assumed responsibility for general education, the review of new undergraduate degree and certificate proposals and the RISE program (which embeds high impact practices into undergraduate curricula). We also have recently launched an Office of Campus Career and Advising Services, an Office of Student Data, Analysis and Evaluation, and a Degree Completion Office. I currently chair our campus' Council on Retention and Graduation and our Undergraduate Affairs Committee and serve as the champion for undergraduate education on numerous campus, university, and state committees and task forces. My position currently involves managing an operating budget of approximately \$9.4M and leading a diverse unit of more than 110 academic and professional staff.

Administrative Accomplishments include:

- Facilitated internal restructuring in University College for increased efficiency, transparency, and effective advising service delivery. Implemented performance management system to support continuous improvement
- Led the development and implementation of a common general education core across the 16 schools and 1 satellite campus (IUPUI Columbus) that confer undergraduate degrees, and developed administrative procedures for engaging in direct assessment of student learning in GE.
- Fostered a culture of on-time degree completion through strategic communications to advisors, parents, and students, resulting in a 133% increase in the proportion of beginning students enrolling in at least 15 credits between 2011 and 2014. Led the development and implementation of degree maps
- Led campus strategic planning for undergraduate education, which culminated in the creation of a Division of Undergraduate Education to better coordinate support for students and curricular innovations beyond the first year
- Led the transition to an extended 2-day orientation program, with concomitant shift to using ALEKS for placement testing and developmental mathematics instruction through adaptive online modules. Created a summer Online Math Academy to support conditionally-admitted students.
- Led the development of online modules through a system-wide task force to support integrated academic and career planning, with support from the Lilly Endowment, Inc. (IU Career EDGE)
- Led the transition to using the Education Advisory Board's (EAB) Student Success Collaborative software platform to support academic and career advising.
